MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE EMPOWERED COMMITTEE FOR PMGSY HELD ON 12th Feb, 2013

STATE: Chhattisgarh

A Meeting of the Empowered Committee (EC) was held on 12th Feb, 2013 at 1.00 PM in the Chamber of Secretary, Department of Rural Development to consider the proposals of the State of Chhattisgarh for **Phase-XII Batch-II** pertaining to IAP and non-IAP Districts under Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana. 2. Details of proposals considered by the Committee for the State of Chhattisgarh for **Phase-XII Batch-II** pertaining to IAP and non-IAP Districts is as under:

3. The Empowered Committee reviewed the progress since the previous Empowered Committee Meeting held earlier and considered the institutional capacity of the State to efficiently execute the PMGSY works with the requisite attention to quality. The Empowered Committee also

considered attainment of PMGSY public disclosure norms in terms of the physical and financial and accounting data entered by the State in the programme software, OMMAs and the diligence in maintenance of the high quality assets created under the programme for the long term reduction of poverty. Before considering the proposals, the Committee discussed following issues.

4. Entry of PCI data on OMMAS

The State intimated that it had entered PCI data for the roads proposed under current proposal. Secretary, RD asked the State to make entry of PCI data on OMMAS for rural roads out of CN-I.

5. Quality control in cement concrete road

The State intimated that in order to maintain the quality in cement concrete road, the PIUs have been instructed to record the entry of tests carried out in the measurement books. Also arrangements have been made to carry out post construction concrete testing by taking out the concrete samples by core-cutting method.

6. Maintenance and expenditure plan

The State agreed to send the maintenance and expenditure plan for the year 2013-14 before issue of clearance letter.

Action:State

7. <u>Strengthening of SQM inspection system</u>

The State intimated that after removing 11 non performing SQMs, it has 23 SQMs for carrying out the second tier quality control, and is taking action to engage more SQMs who will be retired Chief Engineers/ Superintending Engineers only.

8. <u>Submission and uploading of ATRs</u>

Director(P-III) brought out that the State was yet to submit and upload 56 ATRs on NQM inspections. The State assured that it will send all aforesaid ATRs after carrying out necessary rectifications by June, 2013.

9. Preparation of core network maps on GIS platform

The State intimated that it has sent the data required for core network map preparation to NRRDA (Director, P-III). Director (P-III) informed that it is making arrangements with NIC to prepare the maps on GIS platform.

Action: Dir(P-III)

10. Request of the State to utilise the savings of the Phases to accept the balance works of terminated contracts:

Dir (YSD) intimated the committee that the State had sent the request to MoRD to permit it utilise the savings in the Phases to accept the balance works of terminated contracts. Secretary, RD asked to put up the case for consideration as per guidelines, as per guidelines.

Action: Dir(YSD)

11. Updating Habitation details on OMMAS

The Committee observed that as per OMMAS, there are 1100 habitations in 1000+ category yet to be sanctioned whereas proposals for all such habitations have been cleared by MoRD. Secretary,

RD asked the State and Dir (Tech) to plan the unlocking of lock on OMMAS for two weeks and complete the updation latest by 30th April, 2013.

Action: State and Dir(Tech)

12. Completion Plan for the Incomplete works

Secretary, RD asked the State to bifurcate the progress report in two parts for IAP and non-IAP districts, and send the completion plan for IAP districts and non-IAP districts separately. The State assured to complete 1,300 km roads during the financial year against 600 km done till now. Completion will include financial completion and entry in OMMAS.

Action: State

13. Average cost of construction per Km

Secretary, RD observed there is no difference in cost of construction of new road and upgradation of existing road. The State explained that it is due new CD works required and extra carriage of aggregates due to closing of quarries in nearby areas. Also it was observed that there is very steep increase in the average cost over the previous year. The Committee asked the State to suitably reduce costs and NRRDA to scrutinise these costs again and correct the cost in DPRs and OMMAS.

Action: State and Dir(Tech)

14. Five Year post construction maintenance cost

Secretary, RD asked the State to increase the maintenance cost as per Operations Manual. After detailed discussions the State agreed to enhance it to 7.5% of the cost.

Action: State

15. Use of CRMB in BT works

Secretary, RD observed that the State has considered CRMB in all the works proposed and advised to revisit this issue. Director (P-III) cautioned the State to be more careful in use of CRMB and advised the State to issue comprehensive guidelines to the PIUs. Secretary also advised that the State should consider new technologies and roads with blast furnace slag, Flyash, Roller compacted concrete etc.

Action: State

16. <u>Use of new technology/marginal materials</u>

The State agreed to include the roads with new technology and marginal materials in the proposal.

Action:State

17. <u>Maintenance of completed roads</u>

The following is the yearwise maintenance of PMGSY roads as intimated by State Government:-

The State intimated that it has credited Rs.34 crore in SRRDA's maintenance account. Secretary, RD observed that expenditure on maintenance is too low and requires to be paid proper attention. The State intimated that it is taking strict actions against the defaulting contractors and forfeiting their security deposits. JS(RC) asked the State to send the details of such action and forfeiture of the deposits.

Action:State

18. <u>Updation of programme fund accounts on OMMAS</u>

The State agreed to update accounts till year 2011-12 including preceeding three years on OMMAS before issue of clearance of the proposal.

19. Quality Control

Director (P-III) brought out that SQM system in the State is not functioning properly. The State informed that it had already removed EEs engaged as SQMs and going to appoint additional SQMs. As advised by the Committee, the State agreed out to carry performance evaluation of the SQMs rigourously. The State also agreed to arrange training for the SQMs.

Action: State

20. Conducting CBR tests

Secretary, RD asked the State to instruct their PIUs to carry out CBR tests for at least 25% cases themselves for verification of works being done by the Consultants. The State agreed for the same and assured that it will be done before issue of tender.

Action: State

21. <u>Mapping of habitations in the proposal</u>

The State agreed to complete the mapping of the habitations in the proposals before issue of clearance letter.

Action: State

22. <u>Implementational capacity</u>

As per standard calculations by NRRDA, the following is the implementational capacity of the State for new projects

23. Recommendations of the Committee

In view of all above discussions and assurances given by the State, the Committee recommended the clearance of the proposals subject to compliance of following issues before issue of clearance letter.

- 24. The State agreed to comply with following issues before issue of clearance letter by the Ministry:-
- a) The State will send the district-wise (IAP/non-IAP) completion plan for all the incomplete road works sanctioned till 31st March, 2010 and till date.
- b) The State will re-look into the estimates in DPRs and revise the proposals as required for new connectivity and upgradation.
- c) The State will re-assess the cost of 5-year maintenance as per the Operations Manual to enhance it to 7.5% of the cost.
- d) The State will include some of the proposals for new technology and with marginal materials.
- e) The State will send the details where it has forfeited the security deposits of the defaulting contractors in maintenance of completed roads.
- f) The State will update the entry on OMMAS as per current proposal.
- g) The State agreed to update accounts till year 2011-12 on OMMAS for Programme funds
- h) The State will upload the photographs of some of the existing roads which have been considered in the present proposal.
- i) The State agreed to send the maintenance expenditure plan for the year 2013-14.

- j) The State would revisit 21 habitations of sub 250 population (2001 census) informing about any GP headquarters, notified places of tourism (as per para 6.8 of guidelines) etc.
- 25. The State also agreed to verify at least 25% CBR values by PIUs before issuing tenders for the proposal.
- 26. The State also agreed to address following issues in a time-bound manner:
- a) The State will carry out PCI data entry for all the rural roads in CN-I by 30^{th} April, 2013 and thereafter of 50% rural roads every year.
- b) The State will complete mapping of habitations of all proposals by 31st May, 2013.
- c) The State will send the details of cost overrun due to delay and under quoting of rate by the previous contractors separately to consider the request of the State to permit utilisation of funds out of the savings of different Phases.
- d) The State would seek Additional Bank Guarantee from contractors wherever costs are front loaded.
