	Item No.4	<p>Extension of Deputation term of officers of NRRDA. While considering the above proposal, the President NRRDA had underlined the need to evolve an HR policy for NRRDA. In this regard, TORs for appointment of consultant for the above work and notice seeking applications from consultants were uploaded on the website of NRRDA and also widely disseminated but no expression of interest has been received.</p>
	Item No.5	<p>Pay fixation of Shri N.C. Solanki, Director (P-I): As per decision of GB, the matter was settled on file. No further action required</p>
	Item No.6	<p>Upgradation of air-travel entitlements. The proposal was not agreed to by GB. No further action required.</p>
	Item No.7	<p>Empanelment of new NQM and performance review of the existing NQMs: The proposal for reconstitution of the Committee is under consideration of MRD & President, NRRDA.</p>

	Item No.8	<p>Present status of active NQMs and inspection carried out by NQMs in 2013-14 and 2014-15 (Upto September, 2014): The number of NQMs has substantially increased from 66 in June, 2014 to 112 in July, 2015. Similarly, the number of inspections has also registered a substantial increase. During 2014-15, a total number of 5232 inspections have been conducted against the annual target of 4300. In the current financial year also (upto December, 2015) 5006 inspections have been conducted.</p>
	Item No.9	<p>Revision of guidelines for honorarium to NQMs Honorarium to NQM is being paid as per the approval of the General Body.</p>
	Item No.10	<p>Overview of NRRDA's activities in 2014-15 (up to Oct'14): The MRD & President, NRRDA advised that the States should be encouraged to use new technologies through continuous workshops, booklets, films, technology marketing and visits of field officers of one State to the States where such technologies have been successfully implemented.</p> <p>Several initiatives have been taken by NRRDA in this regard, which will be discussed in the succeeding agenda items.</p>

Item No. 2	<p>Changed sharing pattern and consequent availability of financial resources for PMGSY</p> <p>The funding pattern for the ongoing works as well as the fresh sanctions for PMGSY has been revised. The contribution of Centre and the States is to be in the ratio of 60:40 for all States except for 8 North Eastern and 3 Himalayan States for which it will be 90:10. The modified sharing pattern is effective from 1st April, 2015. This information has been shared with the States on 10th November, 2015 and has been subsequently analysed and reviewed in various Regional Review Meetings and Video Conference. Item No. 4 Research work undertaken under PMGSY by NRRDA in collaboration with STAs & PTAs

(i) Three Research & Development (R&D) Projects sanctioned in 2015-16, to the following Institutes are in progress:-

1. Indian Institute of Technology, Bhubaneswar, Odisha for "**Performance Evaluation of Pavements with Stabilized Bases / Sub-bases for Rural Roads**".
2. National Institute of Technology, Raipur, Chhattisgarh for "**Performance Evaluation of some selected PMGSY road sections in the State of Chhattisgarh**".
3. National Institute of Technology, Silchar, Assam for "**Feasibility studies on use of non standard local materials in rural roads**".

Item No. 5

Strengthening of Quality Assurance

(i) **Empanelment of new NQMs**

Three meetings of Selection Committee for empanelment of new NQMs were held between 24th December, 2014 and 03rd July, 2015.

Out of 85 applications considered by the three Selection Committees, 51 candidates have been recommended for empanelment. 20 candidates have not been recommended on account of non-fulfilment of various provisions of the prescribed selection criteria. In the case of remaining 14 cases, applicants have been requested to furnish additional pre-retirement/post-retirement experience details. As on date, 112 NQMs are on NRRDA's panel.

(ii) **Orientation-cum-training programme on Mobile Based Application Software for newly empanelled NQMs.**

An Orientation-cum-Training Programme focusing at Systems and procedures followed under 3rd tier of quality monitoring, Sensitization about the critical issues concerning quality; and Roles and responsibilities associated with 3rd tier of the quality monitoring was held on 14th October, 2015 and was attended by 15 NQMs.

(iii) **Use of Mobile application for uploading the quality grading of abstract by NQMs/ SQM**

With a view to have enhanced transparency and accountability in the independent quality monitoring, NRRDA in collaboration with C-DAC has developed a mobile application on android platform, fully synchronised with OMMAS, for use by NQMs and SQMs.

The data available in OMMAS demonstrates that during the current financial year (*April to December, 2015*) out of the total 5006 nos. of NQM inspections uploaded in OMMAS, 4504 inspections (90%) have been done through use of mobile application. For those NQMs, who have not been able to use the mobile applications, an orientation programme was organized at IAHE, Noida on 4th December, 2015.

In case of SQM inspections during the same period (*April to December, 2015*), out of total 27181 no. of inspections uploaded in OMMAS, 20979 nos. of inspections (77%) have been uploaded

through use of mobile application. States have been requested to assess and indicate their training needs for SQMs to achieve 100% inspections through use of Mobile Application.

(IV) Complaint and actions against NQMs.

Three complaint cases, details given below, were received during 2015-16:

(i) Shri Shailendra Kumar, former Chief Engineer, PWD, UP

A CBI case was registered against Shri Kumar for illegal gratification, during his visit to Himachal Pradesh for inspection of a road work in Kollam district in Kerala in January, 2015. Detailed report of the CBI is awaited.

Action Taken:

Shri Shailendra Kumar has been de-empanelled from the list of NQMs w.e.f. 23rd January, 2015, pending detailed CBI report.

(ii) Shri R. P. Birla, Uttar Pradesh

An FIR was lodged by the State Vigilance and Anti Corruption Bureau, Hamirpur, Himachal Pradesh on 19th March, 2015, on the grounds of demanding illegal gratification, in connection with inspection of road works in Hamirpur district. A detailed report about the outcome of the case is awaited from State Government.

Action Taken:

Future inspection assignments of Shri Birla have been stopped w.e.f. April, 2015.

(iii) Shri Sikher Chand Jain

A report has been received from Chief Engineer Kerala State Rural Road Development Agency (KSRRDA) stating that Shri Jain, after his field inspection in Ernakulam District on 26th June, 2015 misbehaved and demanding illegal gratification.

Action Taken:

Future inspection assignments of Shri Jain have been stopped w.e.f. July, 2015.

This is for kind information of General Body.

(V) Revision of Quality Assurance Handbook for Rural Roads under PMGSY

The current version of the Quality Assurance Handbook (QAHB) in Volumes I & II covering the quality management systems, Quality Control Requirement, test equipments and test procedures was published in May, 2007. The MoRD Book of Specifications for Rural Roads, from which the provisions of QAHB has flown, have since been revised in January, 2014. Several new technologies with respect to Rural Roads have been added in the revised version of MoRD Specifications, 2014 which also required addressing in QAHB.

E-governance and Digital India with the following features:

- The App. available for free download at Google Play store and Programme website.
- Empowers Citizens to register feedbacks /complaints regarding PMGSY roads, supported by geo-referenced photographs.
- Initial response in seven days and final redressal in 60 days time.
- Average 900 feedbacks/ suggestions received per month

With a view to disseminate information about 'Meri Sadak' application to the masses, a Radio Jingle and TV Spot highlighting the features of the application was developed and broadcasted on FM Radio and Doordharshan in 19 Languages in October - November, 2015 and before PM's "Mann Ki Baat" radio programme in December, 2015 & January, 2016. As a result, the popularity of "Meri Sadak" Application has increased manifold.

- (ii) On the occasion of 'Good Governance Day' on 25th December, 2015 Hon'ble Minister of Rural Development, Panchayati Raj, Drinking Water & Sanitation, GoI has launched a **Mobile Application** with following two targeted features:-

- a. Uploading of Laboratory Photographs on OMMAS.
- b. Uploading of Photographs of Stage-wise physical progress of Road works of PMGSY on OMMAS.

- (iii) A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed on 16th December, 2015 Between National Rural Roads Development Agency (NRRDA), M/o Rural Development, Government of India & Center for Geo-Informatics Application in Rural Development (CGARD), School of Science, Technology and Knowledge Systems (SSTKS), National Institute of Rural Development & Panchayati Raj (NIRD & PR), Hyderabad. The project covers the PMGSY roads in following districts:

1. Rajasthan- Jaipur and Alwar Districts
2. Assam- Kamrup and Darrang Districts
3. Chhattisgarh- Raigarh and Korba Districts
4. Odisha- Puri and Nayagarh Districts
5. Telangana- Nalgonda and Karimnagar Districts

The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate space technology based monitoring and assessment of the PMGSY on quarterly basis, based on OMMAS data and PMGSY Division database. The first interim report is expected by 15th February, 2016.

- (iv) A Memorandum of Understanding (**MoU**) has been signed on 27th October, 2015 between Centre for Development of Advances Computing (C-DAC) & National Rural Roads Development Agency

	<p>(NRRDA) for establishment of computerized data base for core rural road network through development of web based Geographical Information System (GIS) linked to road condition inventories in 6 States in the first phase & subsequently in the entire country in the second phase.</p> <p>This is for kind information of General Body.</p>
Item No. 9	<p>Ratification of Annual Account of NRRDA for 2014-15</p> <p>The Annual Accounts of NRRDA have been approved by the Hon'ble Minister on file and placed before both the Houses of Parliament.</p> <p>General Body may kindly ratify the same.</p>

Item No.13	<p>E-Payments to contractors for all PMGSY States.</p> <p>Because of repeated endeavours of NRRDA to shift to electronic payments in PMGSY, at present 8 States are implementing e-payment to contractors. Facilities for e payment through OMMAS have been made available. All States have been asked to mandatorily shift to e-payment for contractors of PMGSY through OMMAS from 1st April, 2016. This would increase efficiency, transparency, and correctness of accounts.</p>

Minutes of the 20th meeting of the General Body of National Rural Roads Development Agency (NRRDA) held on 19th December, 2014 at Unnati, Krishi Bhavan, New Delhi. (List of members present is annexed)

At the outset, Director General, NRRDA welcomed Hon'ble Minister, Rural Development, Panchayati Raj, Drinking Water & Sanitation and President, NRRDA, Secretary, MoRD & Vice-President, NRRDA and other members of the General Body.

2. The agenda items were taken up for discussion as under:-

Item No.1	Confirmation of the proceedings of the 19th meeting of the General Body held on 4th February, 2014.
Decision	Director General informed that minutes of the 19 th meeting were circulated amongst members. He provided brief summary of the action taken on the proceedings of the 19 th meeting of the General Body. He stated that no comments on the minutes have been received from any member and as such proposed that the minutes of the 19 th meeting of the General Body meeting, be confirmed. The General Body confirmed the minutes of the 19 th meeting.
Item No.2	Approval of Annual Accounts of NRRDA for 2013-14
Decision	Director General explained the audited Annual Accounts of NRRDA for 2013-14 as well as the action taken thereon. The General Body considered the audited balance-sheet, income and expenditure statement and receipt & payment account and adopted the same. The Hon'ble Minister, RD, PR & DWS & President, underlined the need to strengthen the independent verification of quality of PMGSY roads through a strong and vibrant panel of National Quality Monitors (NQMs).
Item No.3	Approval of Annual Report on NRRDA for the year 2013-14
Decision	The draft Annual Report for the year 2013-14 was placed before the General Body and after due deliberations was adopted by the General Body.

Item No.4	Extension of deputation term of officers of NRRDA
Decision	<p>The issue relating to the extension of deputation terms of officers of NRRDA i.e. Dr. I.K. Pateriya, Director (Technical) and Shri Sunil Kukreja, Joint Director (F&A) was deliberated by the General Body. Director General informed that the 19th General Body had ratified the decision of the Executive Committee of NRRDA to extend the tenure of deputation of Shri I.K. Pateriya, Director (Technical) for a period of three years i.e. from 26.11.2013 to 25.11.2016. The Hon'ble Minister & President, NRRDA underlined the need to evolve a "HR policy" for NRRDA in next four months. It was also decided that the deputation terms of Dr. I.K. Pateriya, Director (Technical), coming to an end on 24.11.2014, be extended for a period of six months.</p> <p>The General Body decided to allow Shri Sunil Kukreja, Joint Director (F&A) to continue in his deputation term till 22.5.2015 as he has to retire from his parent organization on 31.5.2015 (the term of deputation of Shri Sunil Kukreja, JD(F&A) ended on 29.11.2014).</p>
Item No.5	Pay fixation of Shri N.C. Solanki, Director (P-I)
Decision	The General Body deliberated on the issue and took into account the comments of Internal Finance Division of the Ministry and decided that the matter be settled on file.
Item No.6.	Upgradation of air-travel as per Government of India orders
Decision	The General Body after due deliberation, declined to approve the proposal. <i>did not consider it necessary</i>
Item No.7	Empanelment of new NQMs and performance review of the existing NQMs
Decision	The General Body took note of the information regarding empanelment of new NQMs and process of evaluation/ performance review of existing NQMs. Hon'ble Minister and President, NRRDA emphasized the need to incorporate a representative from the Ministry in the Selection Committee constituted for this purpose.
Item No.8	Present status of active NQMs and inspection carried out by NQMs in 2013-14 and 2014-15 (upto September, 2014)
Decision	The General Body took note of the information regarding active NQMs and inspections carried out by NQMs. The General Body also resolved to further strengthen the system and ensure more frequent NQMs inspections in areas where historically the quality assurance system put in place by State Government have

Decision	The General Body after due deliberations, approved the proposal.
Item Nno.10	Overview of NRRDA's activities in 2014-15 (upto Oct'14)
Decision	A Power Point Presentation providing an overview of NRRDA's activities, particularly, in the field of initiation of studies, evaluations and use of new technology/marginal materials in construction of rural roads, was made by Director General. The General Body appreciated NRRDA's activities, particularly, the achievements of NRRDA in obtaining ISO 9001:2000 Certification from Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS).
