At the outset JS (RC) & DG, NRIDA welcomed the President of General Body, Hon'ble Minister of Rural Development, Panchayati Raj, Drinking Water & Sanitation and President, NRIDA, Vice President of G.B., Secretary, MoRD, Additional Secretary & Financial Advisor, MoRD and other members of GB.

Decision of 24 th GB	<p>2 D (ii) Increase in number of posts of Young Civil Engineers and enhancement of their remuneration</p> <p>DG, NRIDA informed GB that in view of the large vacancy against the posts of Assistant Director (Technical/Project), the Executive Committee in its meeting held on 13th March 2018 had approved to increase the number of Young Civil Engineers from 6 to 12. DG, NRIDA informed that in order to carry out proper review of bridge proposals under PMGSY, NRIDA had floated an EoI to empanel bridge consultants to provide support to Director (Technical) in scrutiny/review of proposals including field visits for according clearance and implementation of LSB works.

Applications from only following two individuals were received who have been empanelled by NRIDA at an honorarium of Rs. 5000 per day to Rs.7,000 per day (depending on the bridge length).

1. Dr. Ram Kumar, (Former Chief Scientist, CRR)
2. Dr. Surjit Kumar Sharma (Former Principal Technical Officer, CSIR-CRR)

In view of poor response received against EOI and fresh sanction of large number of bridges in PMGSY, approval is sought for engagement of a Bridge Expert Agency whose role would be as follows.

- a. Vetting of designs of bridge.
- b. Inspections of bridge during and after constructions.

GB ratified engagement of the bridge consultants and also approved the proposal for engagement of Bridge Expert Agency.

ii. Project Management Consultant (PMC)

DG, NRIDA informed that the Ministry of Rural Development has availed a loan of 500 million USD as Additional Financing from WB under PMGSY Rural Roads. The primary aim of the additional Financing project is to introduce pilot projects adopting Green and climate Resilient designs under component A. In order to ensure compliance to loan agreement covenants and to achieve agreed-upon Disbursement Linked Indicators (DLIs) within stipulated time frame, NRIDA proposed to engage the support of a dedicated Project Management Consultant (PMC) to implement the above agenda.

GB approved the proposal.



Item 2 H	Setting up an Information Communication Technology (ICT) Project Management Unit (PMU) in NRIDA
Decision of 24 th GB	<p>DG, NRIDA informed that number of IT projects under PMGSY has increased significantly and presently only one Data Scientist is in place at NRIDA.</p> <p>In addition, there are three persons provided by C-DAC to ensure smoother functioning of OMMAS. Most of the data captured is through user login interface, which should move towards transaction based software. There is also an increasing demand for integration with various softwares and data platforms.</p> <p>In view of the above, DG informed the GB regarding setting up of an exclusive ICT PMU within NRIDA with the sole focus of managing and monitoring the software development and liaison with various vendors and States. For the same, hiring of a Director (IT) with 15-20+ years of experience in IT consulting, design, development and delivery and two Product Mangers (IT) with 5+ years of experience was proposed. The remuneration was proposed as per NICSII rates for the services. The proposal is under process on file and would be sent to the competent authority for necessary approval.</p> <p>General Body approved the proposal.</p>

Randhir Singh (66 years) <p>DG, NRIDA informed that as per the guidelines of HR Policy the maximum age limit of consultants should be 65 years but consultants with higher age may be considered as an exception in very deserving cases after seeking due approval.</p> <p>General Body opined to re-advertise the post on completion of tenure of the consultants in September 2019.</p>

Decision of 24thGB	DG, NRIDA informed the committee that the contract agreement with Ms/ Mass Management has come to an end on 30.11.18 and a new contract agreement has been entered with M/s Aroon Aviation Pvt. Ltd for a period of one year w.e.f 1.1.2018 to 30.11.2019 General body ratified the renewal of the contract.

Decision of 24thGB	DG, NRIDA informed the committee about New sub heads opened/deleted for accounting purpose in Programme Fund, Maintenance Fund and Administrative Expenses Fund since last GB General body ratified the opening/deletion of sub-heads..
Item No. 8	Entitlement of Travel and payment of DA to undergraduate Civil Engineering Students on Internship Programme in NRIDA
Decision of 24thGB	DG, NRIDA informed that EC dated 13 th March 2018 had proposed that Interns may be granted stipend of Rs.10,000/- per month. Rs.1200/- per day for Hotel accommodation and Rs.500/- per day for Food expenses. Travel by 3rd AC/AC Chair Car and by bus other than AC bus as per actual. General Body approved the proposal.
Item No. 9	NRIDA (Medical Attendance) Byelaws, 2004 - Revision of Rules
Decision of 24thGB	DG, NRIDA informed that modifications have been made in the existing Medical Attendance Rules of NRIDA and EC in its meeting dated 13.3.2018 had agreed to modify the existing Rules. General Body opined to re-examine the matter with reference to the CSMA rules and the submit the same on file.
Item No. 10.	Loan from NABARD for Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana- Gramin (PMAY)
Decision of 24thGB	JS (RH) informed that total outlay approved is Rs. 81,975/- crore for construction of one crore houses in a period of 3 years (2016-17 to 2018-19). Rs. 60,000 crore would be met from budgetary sources and balance Rs. 21,975 crore shall be met through borrowing from National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) by NRIDA. Rs. 14,495 crore has been disbursed by NABARD till Dec. 2018 and the balance loan will be taken during the current financial year. GB took note of the information.

Decision of 24thGB	DG, NIRD A informed that 1 st Revision of Quality Assurance Handbook December, 2016 (Vol. - I&II). The document was released by Hon'ble MRD during May, 2017. Revision of Rural Roads Manual IRC SP:20:2002 published by IRC in



	2002 is under process. General Body took note of the information.
Item No. 12 (a)	Implementation of web GIS for PMGSY
Decision of 24th GB	DG, NRIDA informed GB that GIS has been completed in all the 27 states except J&K and has been hosted in the website www.pmgsy-grris.nic.in. General Body took note of the information.
Item No. 12 (b)	No Cost Extension to MoU between NRIDA and CDAC for the Implementation of National Web GIS under PMGSY
Decision of 24th GB	DG, NRIDA informed GB that the GIS project was accorded "No cost extension of Time" for a period of 12 months i.e upto 20 th January, 2019 General Body ratified the "No Cost Extension to the MoU .
Item No. 12 (c)	GRISS+ enhancements in GIS
Decision of 24th GB	DG, NRIDA informed the committee that GIS has to play a significant role in PMGSY. Therefore, it is proposed to carry out the enhancement in the next phase of GIS in the form of GRISS+ in PMGSY-III. General Body ratified the same.
Item No. 13	Implementation of e-Marg
Decision of 24th GB	DG, NRIDA informed about the software for monitoring road maintenance named 'e-Marg' with the total project cost of Rs. 466.16 lakh. An MoU was signed on 27 th December, 2018 between MoRD, NIC and NICS. The project period will be 36 months and will be implemented in all states. General Body ratified the MoU.

Decision of 24th GB	<p>a. <u>World Bank RRP-II</u></p> <p>DG, NRIDA informed about the Status of Externally Aided Project under PMGSY RRP-II with a loan of USD 1400 million which has already been closed in April 2018. An Additional Financing (AF) of 500 Million USD has been approved with counterpart funding of 500 Million USD by GoI. The project is effective from 18th June 2018, for 32 months. So far an amount of 37 Million USD has been disbursed under the project.</p> <p>General Body took note of the information.</p> <p>(b) (I) to (III): Status of ADB assisted projects RCIP</p> <p>DG, NRIDA informed GB regarding the status of disbursement of loans under RCIP and SRCIP. For this, ADB has engaged Finnish Overseas Consultants Ltd. and ADB has also hired Mr. Subhash C. Nigam as Rural Road Maintenance Specialist w.e.f 10th December 2018.</p> <p>General Body took note of the information.</p>

Strengthening of Independent Quality Monitoring under 3rd tier: <p>DG, NRIDA informed that the performance of NQMs is periodically reviewed and also their strength is augmented. In the Selection Committee meeting dated 21.08.2018, a total of 52 NQMs were selected out of which 22 have already been empanelled and in case of remaining 30, State recommendations were awaited.</p> <p>General Body took note of the information.</p> c. Augmenting the number of SQM and NQM inspections <p>DG, NRIDA informed that to improve the quality control mechanism, the SQM and NQM inspection targets have been significantly increased. 	<p>of 10 inspections per month by one NQM and considering an average 8 months of deployment, about 8320 inspections can be carried out with the present strength of NQMs.</p> <p>General Body took note of the information.</p>

PMGSY AT A GLANCE

Out of total eligible 1,78,184 habitations 1,58,217 has already been sanctioned, out of which 1,45,047 habitations have already been connected. Only 211 habitations are balance to be sanctioned. DG, informed that the target for completion of PMGSY-I is march 2019.

For LWE out of 6432 habitations sanctioned, 2321 have been connected and 4111 are balance to be connected.

With respect to PMGSY-II out of total target of 50,000 km 32,676 km have been sanctioned out of which 24660 km have been completed. DG, NRIDA informed that 8 states have more than 90% completion. 12 States are remained to transit under PMGSY-II.

DG, informed the committee that at present we have 89,900 km works in hand. It was reiterated to achieve the target of 58,000 km road length construction, a pace of 400 km/ day is required. Till date only 22,262 km have been constructed which has been behind schedule and slower than the last year's December achievement with the pace of 78 km/ day. In December, the pace increased to 150 km/ day. It was emphasized that now the pace has to be more than doubled to 400 km/day.

Secretary RD, and Vice president, NRIDA informed that states especially Assam and Bihar to push their limits and connect more habitations.

With respect to habitations connectivity only 8% habitations are left to be connected. DG, emphasized that some of the state are having more than 1000 km of road works balance to be constructed. General Body was also informed that 6529 km of roads have been constructed using Green Technology in 2018-19 as against the target of 12,000 km.

Regarding unsatisfactory Grading V/S NQM Inspection Relation in completed work DG, NRIDA informed that average unsatisfactory grading for 2018-19 till December, 18 is 7.35% as against the national target of 5% and with respect with ongoing works it is 8.66 % in 2018-19 till December, 2018.



In view of inclusion of Housing sector in NRRDA and its renaming to NRIDA , Hon'ble MRD proposed to initiate re-constitution of the GB to include Hon'ble Minister of State, MoRD in appropriate capacity therein. JS(RH) proposed that there is a need for some additional manpower, it was decided that detailed proposal would be moved for the same".
