	Need for work	Villagers were facing problems to cross the river particularly in rainy season. Children were unable to reach school and sick person could not reach Hospital in time due to continuous flow in the river. Products and goods of village could not transported from one place to another.
	Challenges	 (i) It was very difficult to start the work due to flow of water in river throughout the year. The drawing has to be revised due to non availability of good strata and the foundation type was needed to be changed from open foundation to pile foundation for one abutment and one pier. (ii) There was a dispute in construction of one abutment and return wall due to involvement of private land.

		notice that at the location of one pier and one abutment, the
		required Strata was not avialable at required depth. Hence
		Design and Drawing Was Changed from open to pile
		foundation. This required aditional time for Execution of
		Balance work. At the same time there was a dispute in
		construction of one abutment and return wall due to involvement of private land. After several persuasions and

		and return wall. In March 2020 due to covid-19 Pandemic
		lockdown was imposed, so all the work came to an abrupt
		halt. After Government Directives on unlocking process, the
		work was restarted by the end of April 2020, ensuring full
		compliance of the Covid-19 unlocking guidelines and social
		distancing norms. The contractor was facing scarcity of
		labours. So he was encouraged to engage the migrated labours
		who have returned during lockdown period. 834 women and
		1211 men total 2045 labourers out of which total 692
		labourers were migrants and who were registered on Rojgar
		Setu Portal have been engaged on the work from 30 April
		2020 to till date. This resulted in speeding up the work and the
		major work of bridge has been completed.
